Getting on Track in Time - Got It!



Got It! is a program supported by the NSW Ministry of Health, and the NSW Department of Education. Edward Public School has the opportunity to participate in this exciting program.

The *Got It!* team will be working with children in 2021 Kindergarten to Year 2, aged 5-8 years (Early Stage One and Stage One) and their parents, who may be experiencing problems with challenging and disruptive behaviour- at home or at school. The program will give families the opportunity to be part of a fun and supportive group that can improve child behaviour and family relationships and help parents deal with difficult behaviours. For some of these families this will include a 10 week group program.

Challenging and anti-social behaviour often causes problems in many areas of a child's life. It can also be stressful for their family, friends and community.

Sadly, these children can often be seen as 'naughty', rather than as children who are struggling with organising their thoughts, feelings and behaviours.

Got It! aims to provide support and practical help to children and their families, and also to support the school community to help children get the most out of the opportunities available to them.

The *Got It!* team is looking forward to working at the Edward Public School during the rest of this year and throughout 2021. We would like to thank the whole school community for your commitment to improving the wellbeing of children and families at Edward Public School.

An information session will be held early in the 2021 school year.
