Covid Advice for Schools for Term 3

Schools will be open to welcome students back to onsite learning from the beginning of Term 3.

School staff and students are practising good hand hygiene and physical distancing.

All students who have been in Victoria must not attend school until they complete the 14 days self-isolation period since they left Victoria unless they can supply a permit that allows them to return to school.

NSW Health has requested anyone who has been in Victoria and is unwell or has flu-like symptoms arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.

Students need to bring their own water bottle from home. This will help to restrict the spread of germs and keep your child hydrated.

A number of painting projects are taking place around the school due to the scheduled maintenance by the NSW Department of Education. The shelter area and 3 primary classrooms are getting a facelift.

Indigenous Engagement Program

Aboriginal students in Stage 3 (Years 5 & 6) are being offered the opportunity to participate in an Indigenous Engagement Program which is being run by Pretaurus Education Group for the rest of Term 3 and into Term 4. Jennifer Cunningham (Supervising Teacher) and Martin White, will run a fortnightly program. Petaurus are an environmental education group who have worked with many schools across the Murray region over a number of years.

This program is hands-on and activity based, and students will be exploring places both at school and away from school. It aims to give students opportunities to learn more about natural resources like water, soil, plants and animals, why they are important, how they are managed and who manages them. The students involved will have leadership opportunities, and have a chance to provide input to the program. The program will involve indigenous and nonindigenous land managers from our community.

Permission notes were handed out yesterday and need to be returned by next Tuesday as the program will start on Wednesday the 12th of August.

Factsheet: COVID-19 and children

How common is COVID-19 in children?

In Australia, the number of cases of COVID-19 in children is low. Only 4.5% of cases have been in school aged children (between five and 17 years). This figure was 2.2% in early June, 2020. The increase is mostly because of more testing and recently recorded cases in Victoria.

How does COVID-19 affect children?

The virus can infect children, however, they are less likely to have symptoms. Their symptoms are milder and they are less likely to develop severe illness. Children dying from COVID-19 is rare.

Do children spread the virus?

Children, especially younger ones, appear less likely to spread the virus among themselves and to adults. Most children become infected through contact with an infected adult member of their household. While children can have COVID-19, rates of spread of COVID-19 in schools are very low. Outbreaks in schools are rare.

What are the symptoms of COVID-19 in children?

The most common symptoms of COVID-19 in children are cough, fever, runny nose and gastrointestinal symptoms.

What if my child is unwell?

If your child is unwell, even if symptoms are very mild, they should stay home. They should not attend school until they have recovered.

If your child has symptoms of COVID-19 or of cold and flu-like illness, even if they are very mild, see your doctor or go to a respiratory testing clinic. Your child can then be assessed and tested for the virus that causes COVID-19. Your child will have to stay home while waiting for the result of their test. You must follow the advice of your doctor or testing clinic.

What happens if my child tests positive?

If your child's test shows that they have COVID-19, they will be have to stay in <u>isolation</u>. This may be at home unless the home is not suitable or your child is very sick. Your child must stay in isolation until your local public health unit advises you that your child can leave home and return to school.

Do I need a medical certificate before my child can return to school?

You should not be required to present a medical certificate or written clearance from a GP for your child to return to school. This applies for return to school after your child has been home with an illness, including COVID-19.

However, all states and territories provide a letter to you/your child (and/or your GP) when your child finishes isolation for COVID-19. You can present this letter to your child's school if you are asked.

What if my child has other medical conditions?

If your child has complex medical needs, ask your health practitioner whether it is appropriate for your child to go to school.

Advice to schools

The Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) published a <u>statement</u> on 26 April, 2020 on how schools can further reduce the relatively low risk of COVID-19 spreading in schools.

The Department of Education, Skills and Employment also has <u>resources</u> available about how to reduce the spread of COVID-19 at school.

What is the inflammatory disease that can occur in children with COVID-19?

Recently, a small number of children have become seriously ill with a condition known as Paediatric Inflammatory Multisystem Syndrome Temporally associated with SARS-CoV-2 (PIMS-TS).

The link between PIMS-TS and COVID-19 is not yet understood. There have been no cases of PIMS-TS in Australia.

PIMS-TS is rare. Symptoms include:

- feve
- abdominal pain
- gastrointestinal symptoms (vomiting and diarrhoea)
- rash
- irritability
- red eyes
- rarely shock caused by low blood pressure.

Health officials monitor for any cases of PIMS-TS in Australia.

The AHPPC published a <u>statement</u> about PIMS-TS on 15 May, 2020. You can get further <u>information</u> from the National Centre for Immunisation Research and Surveillance.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

My child has lost their order form, so I don't have their shootkey. What should I do?

If you are planning to pay using cash, pick up a spare envelope from your school's administration. If you would like to order online, please call us on 03 5482 3190 and we can provide you with your child's unique shootkey.

My child never received an order form or shootkey.

This is likely because your child was a new student or late enrolment. Please call our office on 03 5482 3190 and we will issue you one immediately.

My partner and I have separated. Can we both order photos?

Of course. Simply use the same shootkey to order for your child. Any students with multiple orders processed will have their photographs delivered to the front office of the school to ensure orders are sent home to the correct parent.

How do I order a family photo?

Most schools will have been sent family order forms attached to the eldest child of each family. These forms are orange on the back. If you have not received an order form, please pick up a spare from your school's administration.

I didn't receive an order reference number, but the money has been taken out of my bank account.

Your order has been automatically received by our system. Simply send your child to school on photo day with their order form as normal.

I can't pay today. Will I still be able to get photos?

Of course. All students will have their portrait taken regardless of whether you are purchasing photos or not. Online ordering will remain open for 3 calendar days after photo day. If you are still unable to order in this time frame, please contact us and we will endeavor to help you out.
